The KIEF president message



Dear Kiwanis Friends,

in the Kiwanis Magazine of October/November 2012 the KI Executive Director Stan Soderstrom begins his address with the words: "Every October, our organization experiences a renewal from within. Our clubs, our divisions, our districts and Kiwanis International all pass leadership batons from one Kiwanian to another..."

He forgot to mention the European Federation but he is right: All officers and presidents change and that is good. The philosophy of Kiwanis is that – in general – nobody should have his office for more than one year.

This happened in the European Federation as well last weekend, i.e. 11 – 13 Oct, 2012, in Leuven/Belgium where we had an Executive Committee Meeting, a KI-EF Board Meeting, our most important Growth Summit

with a lot of workshops organized and led by KI-EF President-elect Marie-Jeanne Boutroy and our Function Passing.

After the Board Meeting on Friday evening Ann Updegraff-Spleth, KIF Executive Director, and Filip Delanote, Vice Chair Europe Eliminate Campaign, informed us about the latest results and confirmed: We are according to plan!

In conjunction with these meetings the European leaders of the KI Foundation presided by KIF Trustee Valeria Gringeri had their meeting in the presence of KIF President Peter Mancuso.

The Function passing in Leuven had a sad aspect also when we said "Many thanks and Good Bye" to some officers whose periods had ended: KI-EF Immediate Past President Jérôme Hennekens, Past KI Trustee Pietro Grasso, Past KIF Trustee Daniel Vigneron, KI-EF Past Treasurer Jan Ceha and KI-EF Past Secretary Tove Fiksdal were awarded by KI-EF Immediate Past President Paul Inge Paulsen and by me for their excellent service. We are looking forward to meet you again in the future, dear friends!



Let me begin my first report for this bulletin with a heartfelt thank for all those who led the clubs, districts and the European Federation in the year 2011/12 contributing their efforts and investing their time to their offices. The last year was successful again ending to our full satisfaction with lot of newly organized clubs and bringing us the full acknowledgement by KI leadership.

Of course, the new administrative year 2012/13 is full of challenges and issues, some of them unchanged like the permanent effort to grow or contributing to our worldwide Charity Project ELIMINATE, some of them are additional like the work on an International Strategy and a strategy for KI-EF. We will start these celebrations in Vienna where the KC Vienna was the first organized club in Europe on 15 -17 March, 2013 (registrations: www.vienna2013.org) , followed by the KI-EF Convention 29 May – 1 June, 2013 in Berlin (registrations: www.kiwanis.eu) where all seven European Kiwanis clubs of the year 1963 will be invited.

After these European anniversaries we will have the chance to meet all our friends of the Kiwanis family at the International Convention in Vancouver on 27 – 30 June, 2013 (registrations: www.kiwanis.eu).

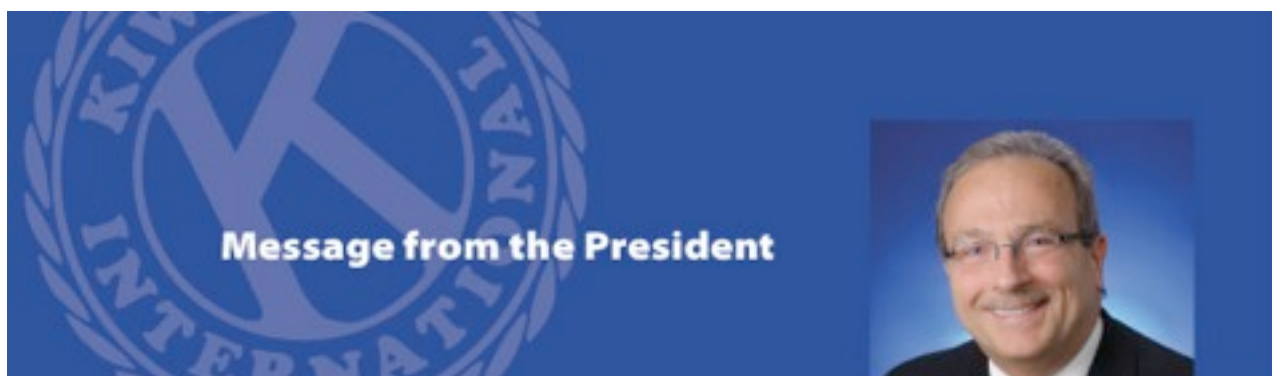

The Eliminate Project is Kiwanis International's global campaign to help eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus from the face of the Earth. The campaign will raise **US\$110 million** for the project.

Quick facts

- 1 baby dies every **9** minutes from tetanus 
- **160** babies die each day from tetanus 
- MNT has been eliminated from more than **20** countries since 2000 
- A series of **3** doses of tetanus vaccine = immunity from tetanus 
- Woman + vaccine = protected baby 
- **US\$1.80** protects 1 woman and her future babies 
- The Eliminate Project saves or protects **61 million** women & babies 
- Elimination = **<1** case of MNT per 1,000 live births ~~MNT~~
